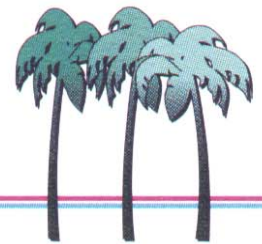

Ask the City: Hazardous Waste

What can I do with the hazardous waste around our household?

City residents are able to dispose of their household

hazardous waste at the Madera County Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility at the Fairmead Landfill located at 21739 Road 19 in Chowchilla.

The facility is open every Saturday from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and is FREE for all Madera County residents. Auto fluids, batteries, pesticides, pool

chemicals, cleaners, aerosol cans, solvents, paint, and grease are just some of the items allowed. Quantities are limited to 15 gallons of liquids or 125 pounds of solids per trip.

For more information, call Madera Disposal at 559-665-3099. This program is funded by a grant from the California Integrated Waste Management Board.



Adult Open Recreational Volleyball

Recreational drop-in adult volleyball is played at the Chowchilla Community Sports Center/Wilson Gym on Monday nights through May 18. A \$2 per person fee is collected each night. New players may register

on-site or at the Parks, Recreation & Community Services office. This is NOT a league. Teams are formed each week for those wishing to play volleyball just for FUN. All participants must sign a

Liability Release & Waiver Form and Code of Conduct prior to playing in this program. *Please note:* Children cannot be brought to the program because no supervision is provided at the gym.

Watering Citations

Beginning April 1, 2009, the City's Administrative Citation Program will be enforced. One of the high priority issues that will be a focus is water conservation and the compliance of the City's watering rules and

regulations. California has issued a State of Emergency because of continuing drought conditions, therefore established penalties and fines will be strictly enforced by City staff.

Fines start at \$100 and get higher with subsequent offenses, so please do your part and follow the City rules. Visit the City website at www.ci.chowchilla.ca.us to view the rules or call us at 559-665-8615.

New Services in the City

Commercial buildings like the Trinity Building on the corner of Trinity Avenue and Fourth Street bring new businesses and services to our city. Just recently, Madera County Behavioral Health moved their Chowchilla office to 215 S. Fourth. A variety of

mental health services are offered to the youth and adults living in Madera County. Also opening was the Trinity Pregnancy Resource Center located at 209 S. Fourth. Watch for the upcoming opening of the Madera Co. First Five building nearby on Trinity.

Legislative Brief

You've heard all about the Stimulus Package, but what does it mean for us locally? City of Chowchilla officials and staff are actively pursuing funds from the federal package to help with various street, water, and wastewater projects.

Other City projects that could potentially be funded with federal stimulus dollars are street resurfacing, sidewalk, curb and gutter repair, alley resurfacing, a water storage tank, public safety positions, building projects, and more. Watch for later updates!
