## Do's & Don'ts

### Do's

### Don'ts

#### Green Waste

Doors - Remove all metal hardware  
Lumber cut into 4' lengths or shorter  
Pruning cut into 4' lengths & bundled  
Tree Stumps/Root balls 12" diameter or smaller  
Tree Trunks cut into 12" lengths or shorter

Dirt, Sod, or Rocks  
Lumber longer than 4'  
Treated Wood  
Tree Stumps/Root balls larger than 12" diameter  
Tree Trunks longer than 12"

*Weeds, grass clippings, and leaves should be placed in your green waste cart for regular weekly pick-up.*

#### Recyclable Waste

Appliances with or without compressors  
Household Batteries  
Metal lawn mowers – remove fluids  
Metal car parts – remove fluids  
Metal pipe 10' or less in length  
Swing sets & metal lawn furniture  
Tires (Tires collected at events based on grant fund availability)  
TVs, Computers, & Monitors

Cardboard drums larger than 10 gallons  
Fluorescent Lights  
Metal drums larger than 10 gallons  
Metal pipe longer than 10'

#### Other Waste

Bagged and boxed waste  
Carpeting & Padding – rolled & tied  
Mattresses & Furniture  
Paint cans, but only open, dry, and empty  
Palm fronds and other pulpy material (*do NOT put in Green Waste pile*)

Car batteries  
Cement, Concrete or Asphalt  
Motor oil (*See special program below.*)  
Paint, Bricks or Roofing Material  
Any hazardous material or potentially hazardous waste, such as pesticides, pool chemicals, etc.

Used Motor Oil Recycling Program offered by the City of Chowchilla



This FREE program allows residents to place used motor oil at curbside on regular waste collection days. Authorized City-provided containers (free of charge) must be used and are available at the Civic Center located at 130 S Second St, Civic Center Plaza or at the Fairmead Landfill & Recycling Facility.

#### \*FREE\* Household Hazardous Waste Collection

Residents of Madera County may bring their household hazardous waste to the Collection Facility located at the Fairmead Landfill (21739 Road 19) for FREE disposal. Bring your auto waste, pesticides, chemicals, cleaners, batteries, paint, needles, and E-Waste such as televisions, VCRs, and computers. The facility is open on Saturdays from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. For a full list of acceptable items or more information, contact Madera Disposal at (559) 665-3099.
